The heath land of the Druids Heath course is a favourite of wild pheasants. The grounds are a valuable ecological area providing a safe haven and breeding ground for wild birds.

Especially important are the varied species of trees and shrubs which are in abundance in the resort: blue cedar, copper beech, sycamore, common ash, holly, oak, willow, redwood, horse chestnut, larch, cherry, laurel, mountain ash, azalea, rhododendron and our two old magnolia trees situated at the front of our clubhouse, which date back over two centuries.

We take great pride in our responsibility to protect and maintain this environment and continue to undertake various conservation projects in order to achieve this objective across all areas.
